ALSO® History and Development

The Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics® (ALSO®) was developed in 1991 by the University of Wisconsin. ALSO® has continued since 1993 under the ownership and leadership of the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP).

This educational program consists of two components, namely a 2-day Provider Course and a 1-day Instructor Course.

The Provider Course is designed to assist healthcare professionals in developing and maintaining the knowledge and skills needed to effectively manage the emergencies which arise in obstetrics.

The AAFP believes that by providing for the program's continued development and management, the patient will ultimately benefit from a more standardized, coordinated, collegial provision of maternity care throughout the world.

The Instructor Course is designed for training Instructors to teach the Provider Course. It is focused on educational theory and how to teach.

ALSO® Overall Goals:

- Assist maternity care providers in developing and maintaining the knowledge and skill needed to effectively manage problems which may arise in obstetrics.
- Provide widely disseminated educational courses, presented by local faculty in their own communities, that can help standardize emergency obstetrical procedures.
